St. Agnes Education Endowment Fund **The Many Ways of Giving**

Pledges. Gifts may be given at one time or pledged over a multiyear period. Payments are arranged to suit the convenience of the donor and to maximize the tax advantages. A pledge is a statement of intent. Three years are recommended and the donor may adjust the pledge period.

Deferred Gifts. Some donors may wish to remember the St. Agnes Education Endowment Fund in their will. This can be done by setting up a living trust, making an outright bequest, or participating in any number of other ways to maximize tax advantages.

Memorial Gifts. When a loved one dies, some families have asked that donations be made to a charitable recipient like our Endowment Fund, in lieu of flowers or gifts.

Appreciated Assets. Donations of appreciated assets, including stocks and real estate, offer opportunities for donors to enjoy certain tax advantages.

Naming Opportunities. Donors may enroll their own names or that of a person they wish to honor whether living or deceased. Opportunities include tangible means such as a plaque placed in a classroom or intangible ones such as altar server award, 8th grade award, etc.

Matching Gifts. More than 500 companies seek to match the contributions their employees make to philanthropic campaigns like our Education Endowment Fund. The process is VERY easy and usually requires only a one page form to complete.

Note. All gifts are tax deductible to the extent provided by law. Check with your accountant or tax advisor to maximize the tax advantages of any gift.
